NOTE ON THE HAY(NA)KU

The "hay(na)ku" is a tercet-based poetic form with the first line being one word, the second line being two words, and the third line being three words. Variations are encouraged, e.g. the "reverse hay(na)ku" where the word-count is 3, 2, 1 or the "chained hay(na)ku" where the poem contains more than one tercet (both variations are included in this anthology).

The "hay(na)ku" is also a Pilipinx diasporic poetic form, which encompasses the reference by the back cover image to "Pinay Power."


